Introduction: The European Project

The first and second nights will provide students with an introduction to the history of Europe and the European project. They will have a presentation of the EU and its institutions and on ongoing debates inside and about the EU and its future (enlargement, the Constitution/revised Lisbon treaty, nationalism, equal opportunities, social Europe, euro-scepticism, immigration etc.). The goal of this introduction is threefold:

- (1) providing students with *basic knowledge about the EU* and the European project, about the ongoing debates, and about the themes and objectives of the Forum;
- (2) *impacting students* from the very beginning with two keynote lessons, as a foretaste of what the week will be about;
- (3) getting students to *hear about the European project*, the European values and that Europe has something to do with their lives and their future.

These lectures and discussion will be supplemented by a visit to the European Parliament and the opportunity to interact with several MEPs¹. Students will be encouraged to formulate their own questions and comments.
